# Letter from the President

In my last two letters I have focused quite extensively on those goals that the board had determined nearly a year ago. This letter will be no different. I believe that the frequent updating of our executive actions is better than appearing as though we are doing nothing. The whole purpose of having a board is to see that we act in accordance with this League's founding principles and purpose, including making improvements and adjustments to the various tenets of the organization, as needed.

One of our primary focuses has been on membership, particularly in expanding and diversifying it. Our organization would have long-ago folded had it not been for our dedicated members. There would be no history, no 85-years strong, if it weren't for active members continuously renewing, or new members joining. We cannot sustain this organization or guarantee its future without members. I am not fond of numbers, or even word problems, that often require doing the math, but this equation is simple: No members = no League.

I would even take this one step further to say, unhappy members = leaving/nonreturning members = no League.) In short, we would not be here if it weren't for you.

The membership committee is aware of the profound significance the League's constituents have on this organization. And, they are also aware that it is time they hear your voices. Historically (as far as we can tell) there has been no membership outreach or survey performed to truly determine: why people join LVW and then continue to stay; what members receive from the League as benefits beyond those we market as such (i.e. discounted rates on programs quarterly newsletter, critiques); how the League can best serve its members. Certainly if we are failing you, the League is also failing. (See equation above.)

It is with this prevailing idea of sustainability and the future of our beloved organization that the membership committee has decided to initiate a survey. In the immediate weeks following the September program, members of this committee (Tommy Walz, Mary Muncil, Wendy Heilig, Kerry Skiffington, and myself) will be calling League members and asking them to provide open and honest feedback on a handful of questions. The committee will make all feedback available to you once the outreach has been completed, with feedback remaining anonymous to the rest of the members. Most importantly, feedback will be used to shape upcoming goals of the board, overall operations of the League, and even more importantly, the future of this organization. Remember, no members = no League. Happy members = Great League.

Allow us to best serve you all by helping us to understand how you see the LVW, why you love it, what you get from it, what you want from it, and how we can make it a better organization for you and future generations of writers.
