Dede is also a journalist and published author of six nonfiction health and organic lifestyle titles from Hatherleigh Press, distributed by Random House and Skyhorse Publishing in New York. Dede lives in West Brattleboro, Vermont with her family, where she designs books and runs her own publishing imprint, DCDesign Books, and the startup Green Writers Press.

Green Writers Press is a small Brattleboro-based publishing company founded by Dede in 2014, dedicated to spreading environmental awareness by publishing authors who proliferate messages of hope and renewal through place-based writing and environmental activism. In the past three years, Green Writers Press has expanded significantly, publishing such authors as Julia Alvarez, John Elder, and (upcoming) Clarence Major. Green Writers Press recently debuted their own literary magazine, *The Hopper*, a cultural space, both online and in print, that allows literature, art, poetry, and interviews to come together toward an invigorated understanding of nature's place in human life.

Sorche is a good friend of LVW returning this summer to meet our writers. From her web site, she describes Fairbank Literary Representation as a small, selective agency and member of AAR, the Author's Guild, and Grub Street's Literary Advisory Board,. Sorche is giding her agency into its eleventh year working with authors. Clients range from first-time authors to international best-sellers, prize winning-journalists to professionals at the top of their fields. Sorche's tastes tend toward literary and international fiction; the occasional mystery or thriller with a firm sense of place; memoir that goes beyond the me-moir; topical or narrative non-fiction with a strong interest in women's voices, global perspectives, and class and race issues; quality lifestyle books (food, wine, and design); pop culture; craft; and gift and humor books.

We are most likely to pick up works that are of social or cultural significance, newsworthy, or that cause us to take great delight in the words, images or ideas on the page. Genres: Narrative non-fiction, general fiction, literary fiction, international voices, mystery/thriller (selective), reference, biography, works on race and class issues, lifestyle, pop culture, cookbooks, science, architecture and design, food and wine, humor.

Lately we have been doing extremely well in the humor/gift/pop culture category, and we'd love to take on more projects in those categories. We do have a strong sense of humor, but above all, we look for a fresh voice, approach, story, or idea.

She worked for Google for three years, where she added Internet sales and marketing to her already extensive expertise.

As chairman of the Unicorn Writers Conference, Jan brings writers and publishing professionals of all stripes together year after year. This summer, she brings her expertise to Vermont writers in July.

On her web page, Paula says: for nearly twenty years, this framed quotation has graced my office: "Après les choses qui sont de première nécessité pour la vie, rien n'est plus précieux que les livres." The quote is from Pierre Simon Fournier's 1764 typography manual, and it means: "After all the basic necessities of life, there is nothing more precious than books."

The only thing I love more than books are the writers who write them, Paula says. She has worked with talented writers in a wide range of endeavors—reporters, nonfiction authors, content creators, from memoirists to novelists, screenwriters, graphic novelists, cartoonists, comic book writers, short story writers, and poets. From Gannett, Greenspun and Prima Games to Disney, Quayside, and F+W Media, Paula has worked in the cause of good writing and good writers. Her specialties include mystery/thriller, SF/fantasy, romance, YA, memoir, humor, pop culture, health & wellness, cooking, self-help, pop psych, New Age, inspirational, technology, science, and writing.

P.S. from Paula: "If you write crime fiction...you should know that I'm very involved with the mystery community, having served four terms as President of the New England chapter of Mystery Writers of America as well as on the MWA board. (I'm currently VP of that organization.) I've also served as both co-chair and Agents and Editors chair on the New England Crime Bake committee for seven years and counting.
